On December 14, the Mill Creek City Council passed a resolution supporting the exploration of an annexation with South County RFA. Prior to an annexation, the SCRFA Commissioners will have to formally approve the annexation. The voters in Mill Creek will also have to approve an annexation. An April annexation vote is being considered.

There are still many hurdles ahead for SRFR's termination of service in Mill Creek to occur. Regardless of the outcome, we will continue to be a strong, progressive, regional leader in fire and EMS. No jobs will be lost and at the end of the day, we will continue excellent service to our communities in Clearview, Monroe, and Lake Stevens. We will keep you posted on future developments.
