Subj: Fire Chief Report for September 12, 2019

Fire Chief's Report:

- 1. Mitch continues to communicate with the attorney for Allied Construction to come to resolution. No formal position has been taken at this time.
- 2. We continue to be busy responding to social media sites and the comments from our citizens regarding our request for a levy lift.
- 3. We have been working with Liz Loomis on developing talking points / PowerPoint presentations and scheduling with community groups to present information on the fire levy. Below is the current schedule of upcoming presentations:

 - b. Sept 14 / 11:00 Mill Creek Grange

We are also preparing to do a live Facebook video, "Brown Bag Lunch with the Chief", on October 14th at 12:00.

- I received an email from the Mill Creek City Manager to begin coordinating a Joint Fire Board meeting for September. They will provide us dates of their availability and I will work with the Commissioners to confirm.
- 5. Commissioners' Waugh, Wells, Fay, Schaub and I attended the Sno-Isle Commissioner meeting in Coupeville on September 5th.
- 6. The new firefighter recruits have been processed and begin the Snohomish County Training Academy on Monday September 16th. There are 5 recruits from District 7 and 1 from Lake Stevens Fire. 1 Lieutenant from District 7 and 1 Captain from Lake Stevens Fire will serve as Company Officers for this academy.
- 7. Several staff members met with Systems Design on September 4th. They provided reports and information on transport billing recovery for both District 7 and Lake Steven Fire. District 7 collections are reported at 96% and Lake Stevens Fire is at 90% of collectible resources. The main difference in collection percentages is write offs due to "levy fund". The District 7 policy is to write off transport bills for citizens of the District, Lake Stevens Fire pursues the funds.

Summary Minutes of the Regular Board Meeting August 22, 2019

Commissioner Waugh called the meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners to order at 1700 hours. Commissioners Fay, Schaub, Snyder, Waugh, Wells and Woolery were present.

<u>GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT</u>: Karen Miltenberger from Nicholson & Associates Insurance gave a brief description of what her group is capable of providing and has submitted premium overview materials for future coverage.

<u>UNION COMMENT:</u> Ray Sayah commented that station 41 in Snohomish County Fire District 4 is currently planned to stay staffed largely due to the community response. The IAFF has had the opportunity to review the resolution for the retiree medical healthcare program and they believe the proposed changes are positive.

CHIEF'S REPORT

Chief Meek discussed items from the Chief's Report.

There was discussion about plans to move forward with educating the community in order to get the Levy passed in November.

MOTION: Commissioner Fay moved and Commissioner Schaub seconded to approve the Consent Agenda. On vote, **Motion Carried 6/0**

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

A. Resolution 2019-13 – Authorizing the Chief to accept grants on behalf of the District, not to exceed \$10,000. Chief Meek mentioned the District has the opportunity to accept small grants on a regular basis from multiple agencies. This would allow the Chief to sign in acceptance for those grants. The board would be notified of each grant the District receives. Commissioner Waugh asked for a motion to move Resolution 2019-13 to an action item.

MOTION: Commissioner Snyder moved and Commissioner Woolery seconded to approve moving Resolution 2019-13 to an action item. On vote, **Motion Carried 6/0**

B. Draft Governing Rules and Policies –

Chief Meek explained that this will be brought back to the Joint Board meeting, however wanted to provide it since it was available at this time. Commissioner Waugh noted the policy states that the Chair will be responsible for approving expense vouchers for other Commissioner's and he believes that language should be removed, as it is unnecessary. Commissioner Schaub mentioned that 3.1 still

states governing board and should be changed to board of commissioners. Commissioner Snyder stated that in 13.1(g) or preparation for should be stricken as there is no way to document this.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DECLARING MERGER COMPLETED, ESTABLISHING EFFECTIVE DATE AND AUTHORIZING TRANSFER OF PROPERTY, FUNDS, INTERESTS IN ASSESSMENTS AND LIABILITIES

WHEREAS, Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7 and Lake Stevens Fire are municipal corporations of the State of Washington organized and existing under Title 52 RCW; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 52.06.030, the Snohomish County Auditor called and conducted an election in Lake Stevens Fire, in the manner provided by law, on August 6, 2019 in conjunction with the State primary election held that same date, submitting to the voters of Lake Stevens Fire, for their approval or rejection, a proposition of whether Lake Stevens Fire shall be merged into Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7 effective on a date to be established by concurrent resolution of both District's Boards of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 29A.60.190, the Districts have determined that the Snohomish County Canvassing Board certification of election results documents that a majority of the votes cast at the August 6, 2019 election approved the merger of Lake Stevens Fire into Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7; and

WHEREAS, the Boards of Commissioners of the Districts have determined that it is in the best interests of the Districts that the effective date of the merger be January 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Boards desire to adopt concurrent resolutions pursuant to RCW 52.06.050 to effectuate the merger of Lake Stevens Fire into Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7, dissolve Lake Stevens Fire, and extend the boundaries of Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7 to include all of the area of Lake Stevens Fire:

WHEREAS, Lake Stevens Fire currently owns assets consisting of real property, personal property, fund accounts and receivables which, to the maximum extent allowable, it desires to transfer to Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7;

WHEREAS, Lake Stevens Fire currently has, and will incur, liabilities that will be outstanding on January 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, RCW 52.06.080 provides for the transfer of assets and receivables upon the merger of two fire protection districts.

Resolution: NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7 and the Board of Commissioners of Lake Stevens Fire resolve as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to RCW 52.06.050, Lake Stevens Fire shall be merged into and become a part of Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7 effective January 1, 2020.
- 2. Lake Stevens Fire hereby transfers the title and possession of all of its tangible personal property and interests in real property to Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7, effective January 1, 2020;
- 3. Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7, hereby agrees to assume liability for all Lake Stevens Fire liabilities effective January 1, 2020.
- 4. Lake Stevens Fire hereby transfers to Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7, effective January 1, 2020, all of Lake Stevens Fire's expense fund balance, reserve fund balance, investments including interest, the right to collect all uncollected regular taxes levied in prior years, and the Lake Stevens Fire 20190 regular tax levy to be collected in 2020 (collectively, the "Funds");
- 5. Lake Stevens Fire requests and directs the Snohomish County Treasurer to transfer all such Funds, effective January 1, 2020;
- 6. The Board of Commissioners for Lake Stevens Fire authorizes and directs Chief Kevin O'Brien to sign and deliver all documents necessary to complete the transfer of the assets of Lake Stevens Fire, including certificates of title to vehicles, quit claim deeds for all parcels of real property owned by Lake Stevens Fire and any other documents necessary to effectuate the transfer of Lake Stevens Fire's assets and liabilities to Snohomish County Fire Protection District No. 7.



ACTION ITEMS

INTERLOCAL BIDDING/PURCHASING AGREEMENT BETWEEN SNOHOMISH COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT 7 AND THE CITY OF BELLINGHAM

This Agreement, made and entered into by and between Snohomish County FD7, in the state of Washington, with an office located at 163 Village Court Monroe, WA 98272 (hereinafter referred to as SNO7) and the City of Bellingham, Washington, a political subdivision of the State of Washington (hereinafter referred to as "Bellingham"), (collectively "Parties").

WITNESSETH that:

- A. The Parties maintain, for the benefit of the citizens of their respective jurisdictions, an organized and standard bidding and purchasing structure charged with the function of securing equipment, goods and services within the limits of all appropriate bidding laws of the state of Washington and the individual jurisdictions; and
- B. The Interlocal Cooperation Act, as amended, and codified in Chapter 39.34 of the Revised Code of Washington provides for Interlocal cooperation between governmental agencies; and
- C. It has been determined by each of the Parties hereto that it would be in the best interests of the citizens of their respective jurisdictions if, in some circumstances, the purchase of equipment, goods and services, can be purchased through a bidding or purchasing process made up of more than one jurisdiction in the state of Washington; and
- D. The Parties hereto desire and by this agreement enter into an Interlocal Cooperative Bidding/Purchasing Agreement ("Agreement") wherein the Parties can utilize each other's contracts where it is lawful and in their best interest to do so and may establish yearly bidding/purchasing for equipment, goods and services of mutual need requirements.

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto desire to set forth their rights, duties and responsibilities with respect to applicable laws, ordinances, procedures as established by the Parties hereto and the State of Washington. The Parties may elect not to exercise their right under this Agreement every year but may do so at any time the Agreement remains in effect; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the procedures contained herein performed and to be performed, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. <u>Cooperative Purchases</u>. The Parties hereto, pursuant to Chapters 35 and 39 bidding laws, Revised Code of Washington, and pursuant to Chapter 39.34 of the Revised Code of Washington do hereby contract to cooperatively purchase goods, services and equipment as a result of competitive bidding or other lawful purchasing procedure and within the specifications established by and for SNO7and Bellingham. Once the bidding or other purchasing procedure has

been finalized and the Parties have been notified, both Parties will finalize their own individual arrangements, including option selection, selections, trade-in and delivery arrangements for goods, services and equipment directly with the applicable contractor.

SNO7and Bellingham agree that each party has no liability as far as the durability, serviceability, and warranty of the goods, services, and equipment selected. It is also agreed that the goods, services, and equipment selected shall be agreed upon by each individual party and will not be perceived as selected by the other party.

SNO7and Bellingham accept no responsibility for the performance of any contracts by the contractor, and SNO7and Bellingham accept no responsibility for payment of the purchase price for any contract entered into by the other party.

This Agreement is offered to allow the Parties the capability to purchase goods, services, and equipment designed specifically for their use and to take advantage of prices achieved by group participation. Any property acquired by a party under this Agreement is the sole and separate property of that party.

2. <u>No Obligation to Purchase</u>. Each party reserves the right to contract independently for the purchase of any particular class of equipment, goods, or services with or without notice to the other party.

The Parties reserve the right to exclude the other party from any particular purchasing contract with or without notice to the other party.

- 3. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall take effect immediately and shall continue in effect until terminated by either party. It may be terminated by either party by giving ten (10) days written notice to the other; provided, however, that termination shall not affect or impair joint purchases of the Parties that are agreed to on or before the date of termination.
- 4. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>. Each party accepts responsibility for compliance with federal, state, or local laws and regulations including, in particular, that party's bidding requirements applicable to the acquisition of any goods, services, or equipment obtained through the cooperative process agreed to herein.

5. <u>Indemnification</u>.

SNO7agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Bellingham, its elected officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers harmless from any and all tort claims, demands, losses, actions and liabilities (including costs and all attorney fees) to or by any and all persons or entities, including, without limitation, their respective agents, licensees, or representatives, arising from, resulting from, or connected with this Agreement to the extent caused by the tortious negligent acts, errors or omissions of SNO7, its elected officials, commissioners, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers, or by SNO7 breach of this Agreement.

Bellingham agrees to indemnify, defend and hold SNO7, its elected officials, commissioners, officers, employees, agents and volunteers harmless from any and all tort claims, demands, losses, actions and liabilities (including costs and attorney fees) to or by any and all persons or entities, including without limitation, their respective agents, licensees, or representatives, arising from, resulting from or connected with this Agreement to the extent caused by the tortious negligent acts, errors, or omissions of Bellingham, its employees or agents.

- 6. <u>Survival</u>. The provisions of Section 5 shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement with respect to any event occurring prior to such expiration or termination.
- 7. <u>Contact Persons</u>. The Parties stipulate that the following persons shall be the contact person for their respective jurisdiction.

- 8. <u>Administration</u>. No separate legal or administrative entity is created by this Agreement.
- 9. <u>Recording.</u> A copy of this Agreement shall be recorded in Bellingham's Finance Office.
- 10. <u>General Provisions</u>. This Agreement contains all of the agreements of the Parties with respect to any matter covered or mentioned in this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement may be amended or modified except by written agreement signed by the Parties. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties' successors in interest, heirs and assigns. Any provision of this Agreement which is declared invalid or illegal shall in no way affect or invalidate any other provision. In the event either of the Parties defaults on the performance of any terms of this Agreement or either Party places the enforcement of this Agreement in the hands of an

attorney, or files a lawsuit, each Party shall pay all its own attorneys' fees, costs and expenses. The venue for any dispute related to this Agreement shall be in Bellingham if the bid is issued by Bellingham or in SNO7 if the bid is issued by SNO7. Failure of Bellingham or the SNO7 to declare any breach or default immediately upon the occurrence thereof, or delay in taking any action in connection with, shall not waive such breach or default. Time is of the essence of this Agreement and each and all of its provisions in which performance is a factor.
