## **Significant Alarms**

#### **Residential Fire**

Firefighters were dispatched to Ricci Road for a possible chimney fire. Firefighters arrived to find a medium, two-story, log home with smoke coming from two chimneys and the roof around them. The occupants smelled smoke and found smoke in the upstairs master bedroom that had started to catch fire after calling 911. Due to the ceiling height, crews went to the roof to extinguish the fire that was in the attic space. Crews did a great job with loss prevention and were able to tarp and move a lot of the homeowners' belongings with very little damage. Great job by all crews involved!

#### **Residential Fire**

On March 16, firefighters responded mutual aid with SCFD #4 to a report of a Single Family Residential Fire. Firefighters arrived and reported a working fire. The fire was successfully extinguished. Firefighters found a victim and removed them to the exterior. The patient was treated and transported to Providence Regional Medical Center.

#### **Abandoned House Fire**

At 6:56 a.m. on March 20, a citizen walking his dog noticed fire coming from an abandoned house and called 911. North Battalion crews responded and found an abandoned house with fire coming from a bedroom window. The fire was controlled quickly thanks to early notification from the neighbor, and rapid application of water. The cause of the fire is under investigation by the Snohomish County Fire Marshal.



#### **Multiple Fires 3/21:**

#### Fire #1

At 12:36 firefighters from Lake Roesiger FD #16, SRFR and SCFD #4 responded to a Residential Fire on S. Lake Roesiger Road. The firefighters worked well together to extinguish the fire and limit the flame spread. The fire is under investigation by the Snohomish County Fire Marshal.

#### Fire #2

At 12:07 a.m., SRFR and Marysville FD responded to assist Granite Falls FD for a Residential Fire located in a garage attached to a two-story house. Crews arrived to find heavy dark smoke issuing from both floors. Firefighters successfully extinguished the fire. The family's cat and dog were rescued.

#### Fire #3

At 4:13 a.m. SRFR, SCFD #4, and South County Fire responded to assist Everett Fire Department with a Residential Fire. The fire had four civilian patients, three of them were seriously injured due to burns. One patient was in cardiac arrest. A SRFR paramedic unit transported one of the patients to Harborview Medical Center.

#### **Training & Safety**

#### **Incident Tactics Training**

The SRFR Tactics class on March 13th and 14th at Station 71 was well attended and all participants received a 16+ hour training certificate for Company Level Tactics. Thank you, Rob Fisher, Christian DiMonda, and Joe Basta for putting on a great class!

#### **Ladder Truck Training**

Ladder truck tiller training starts the first week of April and will be conducted through the second week of May. This much needed training will produce 12 new tiller drivers for the department. Thank you to all the instructors and members taking the class for your commitment to this training.



## **Forcible Entry Training**

The Training Division has found a resource to acquire garage door panels that can be used for circular saw training. The division is in the process of developing a framework in which the panels can be dropped into and easily removed when training is completed. The doors will be used for probationary training evaluations and eventually all personnel will be able to utilize the new training prop.

#### **Nutrition Health and Safety**

Health & Safety has been engaging a nutritionist to assist new recruits in nutrition and hydration strategies for the physically demanding aspects of the Fire Training Academy. We have asked the nutritionist, Morgan Smith, to give a short presentation on these strategies to the whole department. Morgan has developed, with the help of Marcus Dolan, a way to tailor nutrition strategies for multiple job descriptions in our department. Morgan can also offer a one-on-one service for anyone in the department who may have specific nutrition goals. Morgan will conduct the training in person in the three Battalions and it can also be viewed via Teams. Look for this exciting training offered to everyone within the department in May.

#### **Community Relations**

Over the last two weeks, PIEO Mongillo taught 1 second grade class (25 students) at Sky Valley Adventist school, and PIEO King visited 9 second grade classes (225 students) at Sunnycrest Elementary and Fernwood Elementary. Second grade students were taught about escape planning, sheltering in place, and what to say when calling 9-1-1.

So far this school year, we have visited over 1200 second graders!

PIEO King and PIEO Mongillo submitted the Spring 2023 newsletter which is set to drop at the end of the month. The newsletter features various topics including accreditation, heart health, our fleet mechanics, and window falls prevention.

PIEO Mongillo, GIS Coordinator Elsa Sexton, and FF/Fire Inspector Leroy Schwartz held an Urban Interface Informational Meeting at Sky Valley Estates. They discussed egress and what residents could do to mitigate the risk of wildfire in that area. The meeting was a great success, and they received very positive feedback about the information and maps shared.

The PIEOs also attended a free workshop at the Partners in Emergency Preparedness Conference hosted by the WEPIN (Washington Emergency Public Information Network) and learned about social media and responding to the media during an incident.
