Motor Vehicle Collision with Entrapment

On May 23, crews from the West and East Battalions responded to a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision on SR 522 at Paradise Lake Road. Crews arrived to find one vehicle on its top, with the patient trapped inside. The other vehicle suffered heavy damage, but the patient was able to self-extricate from the vehicle. Responders removed the patient from the vehicle on its top, the patient was moved to M31 and transported to Harborview Medical Center. The second patient was transported by M72 to Providence Regional Medical Center.

Residential Fire

East Battalion crews were dispatched to a residential fire on May 26. Crews arrived to find a heavily involved structure with multiple exposures. E32 was the first arriving apparatus and started fire control on the involved structure. Crews were challenged with access to the structure and securing a water supply, but successfully contained the fire to the building of origin.

Paramedic Training Program

As a result of the need for paramedics in King County, SRFR was unable to obtain a seat in Harborview Medical Center's Paramedic Training Program. We were able to get acceptance into CWU's Paramedic Program. Congratulations again to Oleg Mikhaylov who will be attending the program.

On May 31st, PIEO King taught three 2nd grade classes (75 students) at Ruby Bridges Elementary. Students learned about calling 911, escape planning, and sheltering in place.
