Residential Fire Response

On October 29th, SRFR units assisted the Snohomish Fire Dist. 4 with an early morning fire off Broadway Ave. Units B71 and E71 were the first to arrive and found a medium, two-story house with an attic fire. Crews quickly stretched an attack line to extinguish the fire and then completed a primary search before transitioning to overhaul. Units B71, E71, L33, E77, B43, E41, E42, MSO71 and M43 all assisted on this incident.

Crews did a great job of confining this fire to the area of origin and limiting water damage during the fire attack. The house is estimated at \$1.6 million, but the damage estimate per the fire investigator was limited to \$50,000 dollars. Great job by all crews involved.

Fatality Fire

On October 29, SRFR crews responded to a travel trailer fire with a victim trapped inside. B71, E13, E72, MSO71, B31, M72, A73, E33 and L71 responded. E33 arrived and reported a well-involved fifth-wheel travel trailer on fire. E33 stretched an attack line and attempted to make entry and perform a rescue. B71 arrived and assumed command. L71 arrived and was assigned to assist with rescue. E33 quickly controlled the fire and was able to search the trailer and they found one deceased victim. Crews searched the remainder of the trailer and completed fire control. The cause of the fire is under investigaton.

Training & Safety

Live Fire Training

The Training Division organized this year's live fire training for A & B Shifts on October 18-21 at Station 54 in Gold Bar. We conducted 33 fire scenarios in four days and had Mukilteo Fire and Fire District 5 participate in the training. Our lead instructors James Hammeren and Tyler Compton did an excellent job of devising a realistic scenario meant to mirror the features of a small two-story house with a fire in an upstairs bedroom. Our instructors reported great hustle and fireground tempo from crews and will be creating a document to highlight takeaways from the training. The Training Division thanks all the instructors and firefighters who made this training possible, as it couldn't be done without you!

BC Boot Camp

The District sent three members to Florida to attend a Battalion Chief Boot Camp training program developed by Curt Isakson with County Fire Tactics. The members were engaged in an immersive 40-hour class that focused on Battalion Chief leadership, tactics, and successes and failures of real-world experiences had by Chief Isakson. The District will be sending six more members to this training next year.

StormStick

The StormStick Decontamination System was used for the first time at the Live Fire training in Gold Bar. This new tool was extremely simple to use and Firefighters were able to operate and decontaminate themselves without any help. There will be training for the StormStick in the near future. We look forward to placing these on all front-line engines along with other decontamination supplies to assist our firefighters in removing contaminants from our turnout gear and ultimately reducing our carcinogen exposure.

Public Education

On October 12th, Engine Company 31, PIEO King and PIEO Mongillo visited Fryelands Elementary to teach 3 Kindergarten classes our Tools vs. Toys lesson. On October 31st, Engine Company 33 visited 2 Kindergarten classes at Maltby Elementary to teach the same lesson. Students learned what to do when they see matches and lighters, what to do when the smoke alarm sounds, and what firefighters look like in their gear.

We had a successful Fire Prevention Week with 3 Open Houses! Thank you to all who helped make these a success! At our large Open House in Monroe, we saw about 700 people! Attendees learned safety information, saw forcible entry and auto extrication demos, and were able to learn about the services we provide while interacting with our wonderful team members!

During the week of October 16th, the Community Relations team attended the Fire Prevention Institute in Chelan to collaborate with other Educators and PIOs in the state and to learn more about Community Risk Reduction.

On October 20th, PIEO King kicked off this year's school visits with 5 2nd grade classes (125 students) at Woodside Elementary. Students learned about calling 911, escape planning, and sheltering in place.

Station 83's Crew, Program Specialist Larson, PIEO Mongillo, DC McConnell, PIEO King, and Chief O'Brien hosted a booth and touch a truck at the Lake Stevens Harvest Fest on October 31st. The team distributed candy and pedestrian safety information to the 700+ attendees who were at the event.
