Public Education

During Fire Prevention Week, the Public Information and Education Officers (PIEOs) as well as the crew from Station 81 visited five kindergarten classrooms at Mt. Pilchuck Elementary. On October 21st, PIEO King and Station 31 visited Fryelands Elementary where they taught three kindergarten classes. Students learned how to respond when they encounter matches and lighters, what steps to take when the smoke alarm sounds, and what firefighters look like in their gear.

Our Fire Prevention Week Open House was a huge success with about 700 members of the public in attendance! Attendees learned safety information, saw forcible entry and auto



extrication demos, and were able to learn about the services we provide while interacting with our wonderful team members! Thank you to all who helped make it possible!

During the month of October, PIEO King visited 19 second grade classrooms at Chain Lake Elementary, Cedarwood Elementary, Monroe Christian School, Woodside Elementary, and Salem Woods Elementary. Students learned about escape planning, calling 9-1-1, and sheltering in place!

On October 31st, Station 81, PIEO Mongillo, Program Specialist Larson, the duty crew, and Chief O'Brien attended Lake Stevens HarvestFest, where they interacted with up to 1,500 residents celebrating the season.
