## **Significant Alarms**

#### **Residential Fire**

East Battalion: On November 26, at 11:40 p.m., East Battalion units responded to the Sky Valley area to assist with a confirmed residential fire in an attached garage. Firefighters arrived to find an active, working fire in the garage. The fire was quickly extinguished and the home was searched with no occupants found. There was a family dog in the home that would not initially exit, but firefighters were ultimately successful in helping the pooch exit the home. There was a significant number of items stored in the garage which presented a challenge to the firefighters. One occupant of the home was treated for medical conditions and transported to Evergreen Hospital in stable condition. There were no other injuries to civilians or responders. The fire is under investigation by the Snohomish County Fire Marshal. Great teamwork by all responders!

#### **Residential Fire**

East Battalion: On December 3, at 4:25 a.m., East Battalion units responded to a residential fire. On location, responders found a two-story home with an active, working fire on the second floor. Firefighters quickly extended a hose to the second floor of the home and successfully extinguished the fire and contained it to the second floor. The were no injuries to civilians or responders. The fire is under investigation by Snohomish Regional Fire and Rescue. We appreciate the great job by the responders.

## **Special Operations Testing**

The Special Operations Team, Operations, and Human Resources conducted Special Operations Technician testing during the week of December 2. The testing process encompassed all three Special Operations disciplines: Water Rescue, Hazardous Materials, and Technical Rescue. Test components included a written test, an oral board interview, and a practical evaluation. All candidates successfully completed the testing process with seven passing Hazardous Materials, 10 passing Water Rescue, and 10 passing Technical Rescue. Congratulations and great work by all members involved in this process. The next step is to complete the training required for each team. Also, a special thank you to Lieutenant Scott Rybar and Battalion Chief Jamal Beckham for taking the lead on this testing process.

## Geographic Information Services (GIS) Customer Service

## **Station 31 Shop Remodel**

This week at the Shop, garage doors were installed, and concrete for the aprons and carport was poured. Additionally, inside lights and tube heaters were installed. We are still on track for a January completion.

#### Stations 32 and 81

On December 4, the SRFR Capital Facilities and Station Design Committees toured new Bothell Fire Stations 42 and 45. BNB Builders and Miller Hull Architects facilitated the tours, which were very informative as we move forward in the design process for Stations 32 and 81.



## **Station 72**

A few weeks ago, we noticed a groundwater intrusion problem with the septic tanks at Station 72. Superior Septic attempted to seal the potential areas of groundwater intrusion. We are monitoring the repair and currently pumping the tanks twice a week to keep up with demand. The septic design completed by Donna Breske and Associates is under review by Alderwood Water District for approval.
